The Art of Relationships

Our Artist in Residence Nick Bennett is off to the races! Not only have we been collaborating as a church staff on various St. Paul's and community projects, but we have also talked a lot about relationships.

Now why on earth would I be talking with our new artist about relationships?

Well, I think it is because Jesus was and is himself an artist and one of his favorite mediums was people, and his best masterpieces were relationships.

You may have heard the phrase that something is "an art more than a science." Well, that is often true in relationships. Don't get me wrong, there is a lot of good science, biology, psychology, and anthropology that help us understand human relationships and how they work.

But, it is the nature of the variety of people and contexts that seem almost infinite that make it into an artform. No person is totally like the next, no relationship is the same, and the number of people that can be mixed and matched into partnerships, friendships, marriages, families, neighborhoods, communities, towns, and cities is truly incalculable.

Just like the colors on an artist's wheel, mixing, matching, blending, shading, all to create a beautiful masterpiece.

Unfortunately, many human relationships, including more than a few of our own, aren't always masterpieces. People, including ourselves, are filled with all sorts of gunk that can mess up an otherwise beautiful painting. Our pride, selfishness, fears, anxieties, hurt, wounds, guilt, shame,

and sin can mess up the painting.

That is why Jesus is truly the greatest artist. Let me paint you a picture. It is the picture of the cross. I could mention all the people to whom, just by a touch, word, a sit down, a dinner invitation, Jesus brought color, meaning, life and hope to the people he met. I could mention the 12 disciples that Jesus forged together as the first Church, that earthly artists have often tried to depict. I could mention the woman at the well, and the impossible relationship that Jesus forged with her in love, mercy, and grace. I could speak to the iconic relationship Jesus built with the little children as we have seen depicted so many times, laughing and smiling, Jesus is hoisting children from all over the world onto his lap!

Jesus, a true artist and creator, creatively built new relationships with people to himself and people to each other. Lepers who were ostracized were given new relationships with the people and community around them. The unclean woman who was unable to touch or be touched was given a new life of relationships, which meant a new life of possibilities. Jesus, even in touching the blind man's eyes, gave him the ability to see again, that is to see the wonders of the world that God the Father had created. Jesus the Word made flesh, the creator had come to create... less like an engineer and more like an artist.

But like I said, His greatest masterpiece was on the cross. How can something so

The Art of Relationships (continued from page 1) gruesome hold any beauty, any artistic value? There is a reason that it is one of, if not the most, artistically depicted images on earth.

On the cross, with the colors of brown, red, and black darkness, Jesus masterminded the greatest relationship of all. That is God's people, the redeemed, the forgiven, the human creation, me and you with the Father in Heaven once and for all. A relationship of fear love and trust. Relationship established solely on the grace of God in Jesus. There in the ugliness of the human reality, the human situation, the truth concerning how broken our relationship was with God, is the beauty of how God's love could even overcome that bleak picture.

On the cross, in brokenness, in ugliness, in death, there is beauty, and there is a new relationship. You, St. Paul's, are a work of art, not because of your inherent beauty, but because of God's love for you shown in our relationship with His Son Jesus.

A Note from Pastor Max

While learning a new skill can be hard it can also be rewarding. The tech side of Church hasn't always been St. Paul's strong suit, however, three years in with new tech we are finding places to reach into with the gospel!

- Did you know that our website had 100 site visitations last month alone? With 87 new visitors and 14 coming back for more? We see these sorts of numbers almost monthly.
- •Did you know that the past nine weeks we have averaged 15 views on YouTube? That is 15 more people participating in our Sunday morning worship than our already increased weekly attendance averages! It also makes up for at least 20 to 25% of our Sunday participants.
- •All of this with the awesome fact that our church body at St. Paul's is made up of about 40% of people who have joined in the last three years.

It is a new generation which means new challenges to overcome. But St. Paul's, we too have something new going on in our midst and it is awesome!
