How long have you been at St Paul's? My wife Annie and I have been members for about two years. We have attended service several times over the past 10 years, but didn't settle on our church home until about three and a half years ago and waited on a permanent pastor to apply for a permanent church home. We have lived in the New Melle area for 22 years,

What do you do and enjoy doing at St Paul's? I have been an usher for close to two years and an elder since January 2023. It was an honor to accept the role as elder allowing Harold Demien to take a break from that responsibility for so many years. Having the privilege to administer the Sacrament to our pastor is one of my most treasured responsibilities as an elder and usher.

I have a key role in organizing our Oktoberfest and have found it very rewarding to be a part of a renaissance of sorts for that event. It "feels" just right. We quit taking travel vacations 16 or more years ago. We take staycations. Ladies Aid Prepares for Their Oktoberfest Country Market and Other Sales Events

On Saturday, May 20, a group of St. Paul's Ladies Aid members, led by Becky Murphy made "Suet", which is bird food, to put in some of the many outdoor birdfeeders already made by Becky and her helpers. They hope to sell the birdfeeders with their packets of suet in the Country Market at the Oktoberfest, as well as at other sales venues.

They baked about 100 suet items of various shapes and sizes, added some decorations, wrapped them in Saran Wrap, and put them in the freezer until needed.

Suet consists of quick-cook oatmeal, cornmeal, lard, white flour, sugar, and crunchy peanut butter. This was their first experiment with "suet". If it works, they can make more for future fundraisers.

Dear St. Paul's Ladies Aid,

I am excited to write to you that Brooke and I are going to begin the next chapter of my journey into the pastoral ministry by receiving a call as the vicar at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Lockwood, Missouri, for the next twelve months. It sounds like I will be preaching at least every other week and most of the mid-week services! I will also be leading my own Bible Study, teaching their religion class school's third and fourth grade students, and assisting with other aspects of the pastoral duties.

The past two years have been a wonderful time of growth and learning in St. Louis at the seminary, but we are very eager to get out into a parish setting. The city of Lockwood has a population of under 1,000 residency, so this should be a pretty good change of pace from living in St. Louis. It's a rural agricultural community, which should be more reminiscent of my home than St. Louis, so that is a very welcome change!
